It's essential to promote hope when dealing with fear and uncertainty that is brought on during major life changes at any age. The Shadow Buddies Foundations provides all the right tools to comfort and educate families going through a crisis situation. Our mission is to enhance the lives of families in communities, of all ethnic backgrounds and ages. When addressing the psycho-social needs of children and adults, our Buddies are supporting the well-being of individuals, and allow communities to have a hands-on teaching tool to elevate their level of care and treatment. Hope comes from the most unexpected sources. I remember the sheer joy I felt when, from beneath the hospital sheets, Miles' little thumb emerged to signal "I'm good Mom". Our MISSION

Our Mission of Charity and Hope

The mission of the Shadow Buddies Foundation is to provide emotional support through education due to illness, disability or medical treatments. The foundation accomplishes this through unique programs designed to enhance the lives of children and adults. In pursuit of that mission, the foundation will continually raise funds, develop new programs and build relationships between organizations with complimentary goals.

The Shadow Buddies Foundation is dedicated to providing support and knowledge to children with severe illnesses, disabilities, and going through a crisis situation. The Shadow Buddies' programs are the primary vehicle for acting on the Foundation's mission. Shadow Buddies are condition-specific

"Buddy" dolls designed to be a friend, "just like me", to children enduring medical treatments or emotionally traumatic situations. The Buddies

represent more than 36 conditions to date. Each Shadow Buddy serves to provide critical comfort to children in frightening and often confusing situations.

Crafted from muslin and carefully researched to represent a child's unique medical condition, each Buddy has a driven purpose to provide hope, love, and joy into the hearts of children and their families in need. Each year our goal is to deliver approximately 40,000 Shadow Buddies worldwide with 5,000 of the Buddies staying locally in Kansas City.

Our PROGRAMS



Pink Parties

Launched in 2010 at the Children's Healthcare of Atlanta-Scottish Rite, the Pink Party has become one of our most sought-after programs by Child Life Specialists and pediatric hospitals throughout the United States. We've been honored to partner with Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City and support the Great HeighTS Clinic by hosting three parties a year, pampering precious girls diagnosed with Turner Syndrome. In addition to Kansas City, Missouri, we host parties in seven other states. And we don't forget about the mothers, grandmothers, sisters, aunts, or any other caregivers who are always by the girls' side. They get pampered too! Our Pink Parties feature make-up application, hair styling, nail painting, and fun crafts. Each girl is given her very own Shadow Buddy wearing a tutu. With COVID restrictions lifted, we were thrilled to resume our Pink Party at the Great HeighTS Clinic in November 2023.

Superhero Program

In 2015, in celebration of our 20th anniversary, we launched the Superhero Shadow Buddy Program giving children the power of extra strength, courage, and love to fight their battles. Every Shadow Buddy that was delivered or donated, came with a Buddy-sized Superhero cape and mask. Through play-therapy we see how powerful it is for a child to have their own Superhero Buddy to help them get through tough days and treatments. Following our initial success, we were able to expand the Superhero Program to include the children themselves, giving them a child sized cape and mask to match their Buddy.

17,500 Superhero Shadow Buddies have been delivered to young patients in the hospital.

8,400 child sized Superhero Capes and Masks have been distributed to children matching their Buddy since 2019.

Summer Backpack Program

Each year, our goal is to provide 1,000 Backpacks to special need camps here in Kansas City and around the country. Shadow Buddies are donated to these camps as well to ease the first day jitters by welcoming the special campers. Endorsed by camp counselors and nurses at the camps, the Buddies are used to teach children about their medical condition and promote a positive self-image. Shadow Buddies Backpacks are loaded with all the camp essentials that include fun activities for boys and girls, toothbrush, comb, water bottle and of course, a specific Buddy for each camp! Their Buddy will be a year-long reminder of the new friendships they made at camp and of special memories that will last a lifetime. Funds raised from our Golf Classic and other private donations support our Backpack program.

Courageous Crew

In 2020, the Shadow Buddies Foundation introduced the "Courageous Crew" Buddies. Due to the COVID pandemic, these Buddies were launched at the perfect time to support frontline heroes. The five Buddies are a Police Officer, First Responder, Firefighter, Physician/Nurse, and Military/Veteran. These Buddies comfort the children of these public servants who are forced to be away from their families for extended periods of time. In addition, the frontline heroes can give these Buddies to children they interact with during traumatic circumstances. Our goal is to continue to highlight and expand this program for years to come. The "Courageous Crew" was instrumental in 2023 due to the affects on the ongoing pandemic.

5,000 Courageous Crew members have been delivered since 2020, including 1,500 in 2023.

Magical Flight to the North Pole

In December, some Christmas magic helped over 50 terminally ill and medically-challenged children receive airline boarding passes with the destination being the North Pole. Accompanied by a parent, these special children boarded an airplane and were greeted by the pilot and his flight crew specially dressed for the occasion. The flight took off and flew around the city for 45 minutes while other family member and countless volunteers waited for the children to land and enter the "North Pole" — a winter wonderland in a separate location of the terminal. They were greeted by professional sports team mascots, choirs, superheros, and princesses. Santa made a grand entrance with his motorcade and Secret Service. Lots of goodies to eat, activities, and excitement for the entire family was provided for this special holiday event. Each child, and their siblings, received a huge bag of toys from Santa and a special Shadow Buddy that had been wrapped with love, and donated from businesses in the community. The North Pole and Holiday Hugs toys that are provided to medically-challenged children were made possible by our wonderful volunteers, staff, board members, and community partners. We are very grateful for our new partnership with Delta Airlines, who sponsored the 2023 Magical Flight.

Holiday Hugs Program

In October of each year, we kick off our annual "Holiday Hugs Toy Drive" that provides thousands of toys, Shadow Buddies, and dinner to hundreds of Kansas City metro families. The toys are distributed to families, shelters, and other like-minded non-profits that are passionate about helping medically-challenged children and families in need during the holidays. We adopt close to 600 families in our community to provide gift bags of toys and goodies. In 2023 we once again had such an overwhelming response from our Board Members and community businesses, that we were able to donate additional toys to stock the shelves of other agencies in our community. This year we truly sprinkled lots of magic and granted holiday wishes to children all across the Kansas City area.

We celebrated our 28th Annual Gala in 2023, at the Marriott Hotel in Overland Park, KS. Launched in 2016, the "Shoot for the Kids" clay target event is one of the most thrilling events put on by the Shadow Buddies Foundation. Each year, teams from around the Kansas City metro area come together to raise money for our "Courage Capes — Capes for Kids" program. Our goal is to raise \$40,000 to support medically-challenged children battling life-threatening conditions and going through various medical treatments. Our "Courage Capes" provide children with a child size Superhero Cape and mask, and allows them to do play therapy to become the hero they truly are, while battling their medical condition. This is a sell-out event and a great day of food, friends, and fun on the course.

Proceeds from our "Shoot for the Kids" event has allowed over 29,000 children to benefit from our "Courage Capes" and masks program



Birdies, Bogies & Buddies

Teeing off in 2009, "Birdies, Bogeys and Buddies" Golf Tournament has become one of the most popular tournaments in the Kansas City area. The funds raised from the tournament benefit the Shadow Buddies Foundation Summer Backpack Program that supports medically-challenged children attending specialty camps and summer youth programs through the Armourdale Renewal Association. The event is hosted by local Kansas City favorites and professional athletes such as Tony Gonzalez, Matt Besler, and Ryan Succop. Golfers enjoy a day filled with lunch, cocktails and a silent auction.

18,600 Backpacks have been donated to specialty camps in Kansas City.
